**RV, BOAT, TRAILER, ETC.**  
**PARKING REGULATIONS**

No recreational vehicle (including ... motor home, utility trailer, travel trailer, truck camper, boat, snowmobile, camping trailer, racing trailer, personal watercraft, four-wheeler, or other such item used primarily for recreational purposes or the trailer on which such vehicle is hauled) shall be parked or stored on any street, alley, dead-end or public right-of-way in the City of St. Clair, except for the express purpose of loading/ unloading.



## RECREATIONAL FIRE

A 3' X 3' recreational campfire using clean, dry, untreated wood is the only type of burning permitted in St. Clair. Burning leaves, grass and other materials is NOT allowed.

The following is an excerpt from the City of St. Clair Burning Ordinance:

### RECREATIONAL CAMPFIRE REGULATIONS AND SAFEGUARDS:

- Recreational campfires shall not be more than three (3) feet in diameter nor more than three (3) feet in height, with a flame height of no more than four (4) feet.
- Recreational campfires shall be located at least fifteen (15) feet from any structure or property line.
- Only clean, dry, untreated wood, in lengths less than three (3) feet and approved starter materials shall be used in a recreational campfire.
- Recreational campfires shall produce minimal detectable smoke, odor or soot beyond the property line.
- Wind and weather conditions shall be considered prior to lighting a recreational campfire.
- Recreational campfires shall be attended at all times by a person 18 years of age or older who is knowledgeable in methods of extinguishing fires and who has tools for extinguishing the fire readily available.
- Recreational campfires shall be extinguished completely before leaving the campfire site.
- Every effort shall be taken to avoid creating a nuisance or a health or safety hazard while burning a recreational campfire.
- Recreational campfires shall be prohibited in the City of St. Clair at any time when the Blue Earth County Sheriff's Department or other authority has issued a burning ban.

Call 9-1-1 immediately to report any violation to the City Burning Ordinance.
