

GARDEN METER

Residents may purchase a second water meter from the City for outside water use. Sewer fees will not be charged on the water used through the garden meter. Contact the City Clerk at 245-3494 for more information or to obtain a garden meter. PLEASE NOTE: The City does not install the garden meter. Meters should be installed by a licensed plumber.

GRASS CLIPPINGS



Please mow your lawn away from the street so your grass clippings do not end up in the City storm sewer. The storm sewers are not designed to handle quantities of leaves and grass clippings. During a rainstorm, grass clippings and other yard debris can quickly plug storm drains and pipes.



STATE BUILDING CODE

Proclamation

WHEREAS: The United States of America was founded upon the premise that all citizens should enjoy the blessings of freedom and liberty; and

WHEREAS: The freedom and liberty that Americans enjoy, and which are longed for by people the world over, are the direct result of the many sacrifices made by America's veterans in securing these blessings; and

WHEREAS: Many Minnesotans have made the supreme sacrifice in defense of the cause of freedom; and

WHEREAS: It is fitting and proper that we recognize the courageous efforts of our veterans who have sacrificed so much of themselves to secure freedom and liberty for all Americans; and

WHEREAS: The American Legion Auxiliary, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, and the Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary have adopted the poppy as their commemorative symbol; and

WHEREAS: Each year, disabled veterans assemble and distribute memorial poppies, thereby creating a tangible tribute that honors our nation's fallen heroes and benefits living veterans and their families.

NOW, THEREFORE, I Douglas Westphal, Mayor of the City of St. Clair, Blue Earth County, Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of May 2012 as:

POPPY MONTH

in the City of St. Clair and encourage all citizens to recognize the poppy as a symbol designated to honor the brave individuals who have made the ultimate sacrifice in the name of freedom.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set by hand and caused to be affixed the official seal of the City of St. Clair, Blue Earth County, Minnesota this 10th day of May 2012.
