

Snowmobile Operators

Within the City of St. Clair snowmobiles are to be driven on the right hand lane of the street as close as practical to the curb or edge of the street.

IT IS UNLAWFUL TO OPERATE A SNOWMOBILE:

- On a public sidewalk.
- On boulevards within any public right-of-way.
- On private property (without permission).
- In the City Park.

Anyone witnessing snowmobile violations are asked to call 911 immediately to report the incident.

Don't get towed ... move your vehicle!



Use off-street parking after any snowfall of 1" or more until the street has been plowed curb to curb.

If snowplows are forced to go around parked vehicles, the snow surrounding the car can create a hazard to the traveling public as well as plow operators and equipment.

Vehicles that have been parked on the street longer than twenty-four (24) hours after a snowfall event and have prohibited the complete clearing of the street are subject to towing and impounding at the owners expense.

Sidewalk Snow Removal



The resident/occupant of any property abutting any public sidewalk is responsible for ice and snow removal.

All ice and snow must be removed from public sidewalks within 36 hours after the ice or snow has ceased to fall.

If the sidewalk is not cleared within the designated time the City will hire it done at a charge to the property owner of \$50.00 per time.
