

Tree Trimming

Residents with trees overhanging public sidewalks and streets are asked to trim their trees in accordance with the City Ordinance Code. Trees should be trimmed and maintained at a distance of 8' above sidewalks and 12' above streets. This distance allows for safe pedestrian travel on sidewalks and adequate clearance for fire and emergency vehicles on our streets.

Recreational Fire



A 3' X 3' recreational campfire (with clean, dry, untreated wood) is the only type of burning permitted in the City of St. Clair. Burning leaves, grass, paper, waste materials, construction debris, etc. IS NOT ALLOWED.
